



As you may be aware we are having a lot of ongoing issues at the beginning and end of the school day regarding parking and volume of traffic. The police are aware and you will probably have noticed a heightened police/traffic warden presence, while we try to resolve some of these issues. We would like to remind all road users accessing the school, that the main gate area is not a sensible place to park as it blocks safe access for our pupils to the school. Additionally this area is clearly marked with zig zags and double yellow lines. Parking there is both unsafe and in breach of traffic laws.

Tom Curtis the traffic warden has informed us that one driver has already been issued with a parking charge and also a breach of the peace police charge. Further parking tickets **will** be issued on the spot to anyone parked illegally.

We thank you for your cooperation in keeping everyone accessing our school safe.

School Gate Closures

Following on from the above article, can we please remind everyone that the school gates are closed in the morning between the hours of 8:30-9:15 Mon-Fri and in the afternoon from 2:30-3:45 Mon-Thurs, 11:30-12:45 Friday. These times coincide with both St Luke's and Mayfield's school opening and closing times. The reason for the closures is to prevent vehicles moving within the school grounds and to promote safety for the children en route to and from school. There is signage at the gate entrance informing of the closure time, however we still have many people asking to be let out of the gates after these have been closed. We have been informed by our janitorial staff that they have been instructed **not** to open these gates during stipulated times for any reason. Can I please ask for your help in informing the wider community.



Snow procedures - planning ahead!

In the event of snow and icy weather now that winter is here, please note that it is impossible to clear the whole playground. Pupils should enter school using the main entrance only in deep snow. A path from the roadside to the main entrance will be maintained by the Janitor. Other paths will be gritted as much as possible.

In the event of severe weather, please check the school and Midlothian websites and local radio stations for information on potential school closures, however we will endeavour to keep school open as much as possible.
