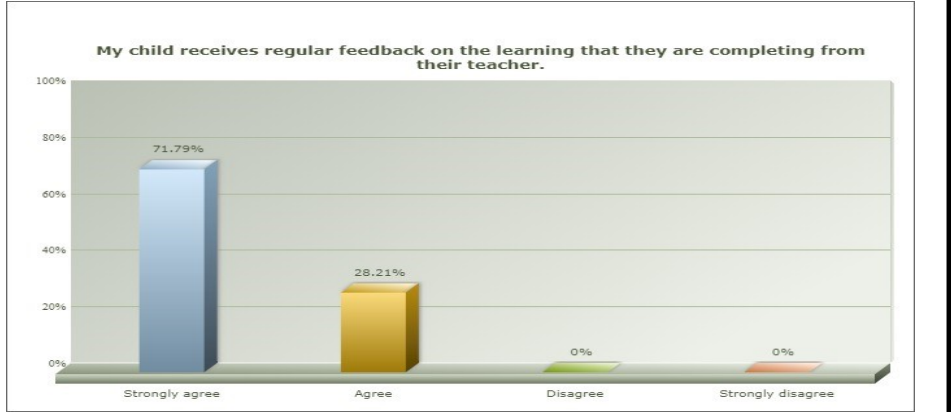



<b>You Said</b>	Over 23% of families felt that live lessons and meets were not taking place with their child's class teacher
<b>We Did</b>	All teachers received training following this feedback. Minimum expectations were put in place to ensure all pupils had access to live lessons. School had to access supports for digital devices for staff to ensure they had the equipment to complete live teaching.



<b>You Said</b>	100% of families felt that there was regular feedback on learning completed remotely.
<b>We Did</b>	We are delighted with this response! Staff have worked extremely hard to comment on learning and to support our learners and families during remote learning. Our senior leadership team have been monitoring learning and the support from our teachers throughout this time. We will continue to improve on this as we move forwards.

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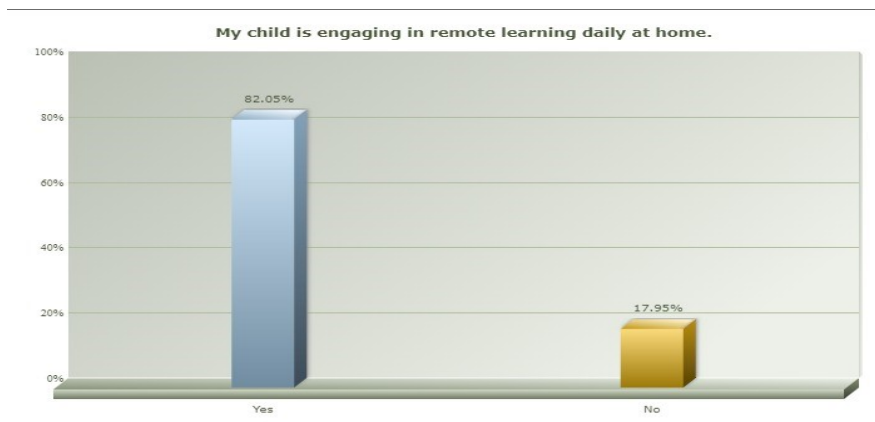
## Parental Remote Learning Feedback

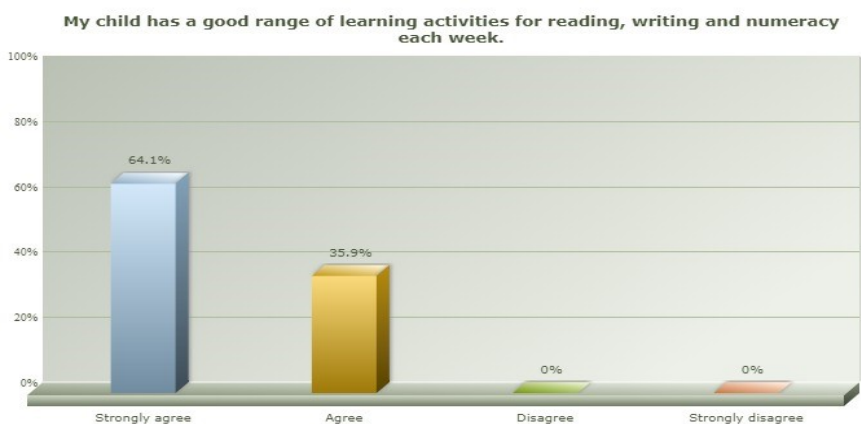
# Be the best we can be!

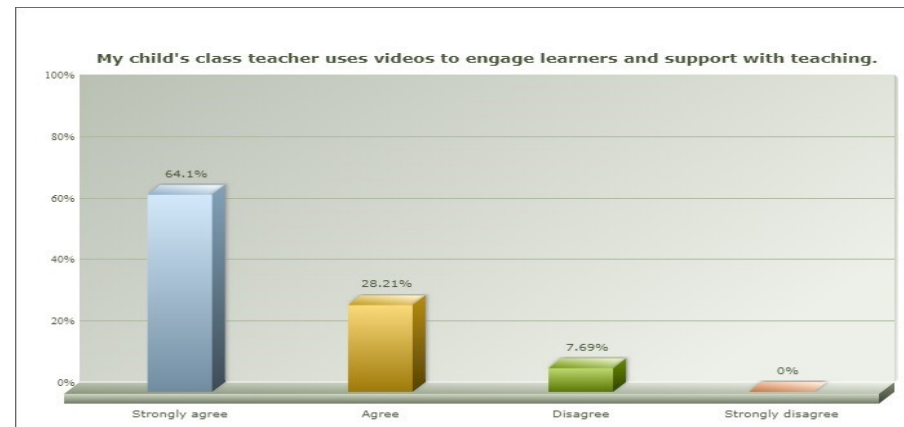
We are delighted with your comments and look forward to using this type of survey moving forwards to gain parental feedback and next steps.



<b>You Said</b>	82.05% of children are engaging in remote learning
<b>We Did</b>	We have clear systems in line with local authority and national expectations to support non-engaging pupils. We have supported families with digital devices and remote learning packs.



<b>You Said</b>	100% of our families felt that our school was providing a good range of learning in literacy and numeracy weekly
<b>We Did</b>	We will meet with teaching staff to support with clear planning of literacy and numeracy activities for homework using seesaw/google classroom moving forwards. We will make sure that every child can access the activity and it is matched to their level of learning moving forwards should remote learning be required in the future.



<b>You Said</b>	Over 90% of families agreed with this statement. Some comments felt that this could be more consistent across classes.
<b>We Did</b>	Teachers received support to ensure that they were confident in using videos to interact in both a live video and a pre-recorded video. The school set expectations for all classes following this feedback to ensure that all teachers set videos for learners on a daily basis. Teachers will continue to develop their skill set when returning to school to ensure we can continue to use these supports effectively in the future.
